Ophthalmia neonatorum is the child unless prevented. Keep the discharge of water as soon as the head is born. Burn the cotton wool; the disease is infectious. Do not include the eyes in the first general bath. Drop in the eyes of the child as soon as it is born a one (1) per cent solution of nitrate of silver (or such other preventative as may be recommended by a competent physician.) Midwives and parents should report to a physician immediately a case of sore eyes in any recently born child. Any delay increases the chances of the child becoming permanently blind. From one-fourth to one-half of the cases of blindness in asylums is due to sore eyes in the new born.
